

NATURAL HUMMINGBIRD FEEDERS

Generally, these flowers attract hummingbirds because they are tubular, and/or they are red/orange, and/or they have abundant nectar. If the flower is lucky, the hummingbird's forehead will collect pollen from its anthers.
